Online meeting of the Council of the Czech National Taekwon-Do ITF Union



26.3. another meeting of the Czech Taekwondo National Taekwondo Federation (CzNTU) Council took place, which had to be limited to the online form again due to the still valid governmental measures. The main point of the meeting was this time to call an extraordinary membership meeting after the sudden death of the long-time president of CzNTU, Mr. Viktor Stein. But other very important topics were also discussed, including the proposals for this year's events as well as the financial report for the previous year and the budget for the current year. The meeting was very stimulating and was accompanied by a lively and, above all, fruitful discussion, as several new points came up for consideration.

Coaches also need to further their education and so the Chairman of the Technical Committee of the CzNTU, Kamil Kolofík, participated in the online seminar First FujiMae Online Tour.

The seminar was led by group of the most competent persons-Master Jerzy Jedut VIII. Dan, Master Jarosław Suska VII. Dan and int. Inst. Leonardo Oros Duek VI. Dan. Furthermore, the pupils of the Polish club of Master Jedut MKS Lewart AGS Lubartów were at the hands of the masters and for demonstration in the Lubartow gym, where the stream came from.

There were more than 160 participants. As special guest we could meet the President of Taekwon-Do ITF Grandmaster Paul Weiler, who gave a short opening speech. There were also other very important Taekwondo personalities - for example Grandmasters Kim Ung Lan and Hector Marano. The attendance was truly world class - we could see masters and instructors from America, Europe and Asia.

seminar divided into four-hour was several It started with warm-up exercises and some basic techniques with an focus on the correct sine wave, both performed by Master Jedut. In the next block, Master Suska analyzed the Yul-Gok and Ge-Baek patterns in detail, pointing out the biggest difficulties of these patterns and the most common mistakes. The following block was in charge of the int. ins. Duek - it was a self-defense block, where he started with simpler self-defenses for the youngest taekwondo students and later added some techniques for older students. The next block, again very interesting, was focused on 3, 2 and 1 step sparring. Under the leadership of Master Jedut, his students performed several sparring routines with different techniques. The technical side of sparring was always highlighted - distances, angles and measuring if necessary. And Master Jedut was also in the lead for the last block. which was a demonstration of techniques from patterns that are not practiced that often. Here the master strongly appealed for their more frequent inclusion in training and their consistent practice. In this block were also included a few exercises in the protectors - it was mainly about the movement in the ring to keep distance. directions. the changes of movement

All of the above mentioned Masters deserve great appreciation for this perfectly prepared seminar, which was also presented in an on-line format, which was certainly big challenge. Last but not least, a big thank to the students of the MKS Lewart Lubartów club for their precise demonstrations.

I firmly believe that at the next seminar we will be able to meet in the gym and not in front of the screen.



First aid course



The next step in education, which is also very important for trainers, is the successful passing of the course called First Aid Member by our trainer Lenka Kolofíková (IV. Dan).

The course with a duration of 80 hours took place over the few weekends in April and May at the training centre in Prague. It was a course accredited by the Ministry of Education and was conducted by professional paramedics and medical staff.

As the name indicates, the main topic of the course was first aid. And not only in the theoretical level, but especially in the practical one.

In the First Aid section, we not only reviewed how to proceed when an injured person is found, but also learned the correct way to perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation using dummies. We also learned about the equipment of the ambulance and tried the application of fixation aids and the use of some diagnostic equipment.



First aid course



The teaching paramedics strongly highlighted the positive effect of the increasingly available automatic external defibrillators, known by the acronym AED. These are now a common part of equipment in shopping centres, public offices, large companies, infocentres and sports centres. Some police cars are also equipped with this life-saving device.

The course also included lectures on hygiene and epidemiology, care of the sick, basic medical documentation, pedagogics, mass emergencies, triage of the injured and procedures at the accident scene.

We hope that it will not be necessary to use the acquired knowledge and experience in practice. But if something like this does happen, we will know how to help.





On Sunday 20th June afternoon run online seminar named Sport Psychology. Lecturers, Prof. Dr. Janel Gauthier and Sbn. Leonardo Oros Duek conducted very engaging class. More than 50 instructors, trainers and assistants were participated on this event.

The workshop was opened by the ITF President, Grandmaster Paul Weiler, who welcomed the seminar participants as always with a kind smile.

The first part of the workshop was led by Sbn. Leonardo Oros Dueka (VI. Dan) from Israel. He had prepared some photos and pictures for us to think about at the beginning. The participants could say how they felt about the pictures or what they saw in them. He introduced us to the main goals of sport psychology and also its history, which dates back to 1879. He used examples to explain what mental strength means, how to change our internal settings (our own thought processes) and the importance of internal positive talk.

The second part of the lecture was given by Professor Janel Gauthier, Doctor of Psychology (VI. Dan) from Canada. He focused mainly on explaining the characteristics of winners and the perception and effect of internal and external influences. He also stressed that effective training is mainly about a balance between opposing elements e.g. training vs. rest, work vs. play etc. According to his lecture, a very important part of training is also the correct setting of goals and appropriate psychological influence on the student or competitor. He always explained everything properly with examples, which is often very essential for understanding psychology. Finally, there was space for questions, which were not few.

The participants expressed their gratitude to the lecturers for their very educational presentations, and we were assured by Sbn. Duek that it was definitely not all about sport psychology. The second part of the seminar is already being prepared and we are already looking forward to it. It was nice to see familiar faces again, even if only through the screen, but we hope for better tomorrows and soon meetings together...



Summer camp in Hrachov



Not even a global pandemic can stop the desire to exercise. Members of the Taekwon-Do Sparring Mnichovice school as well as people who are not familiar with this art of self-defence went to a summer self-defence camp in the middle of July. This year we were able to lay our heads down at the Star line Hrachov recreation centre. Taekwon-Do Sparring school coaches (Ivana Bohatá I. Dan, Lucie Bohatá I. Dan, Jakub Roubal II. Dan) and Taekwon-Do Lions school coaches (Kamil Kolofík V. Dan, Lenka Kolofíková IV. Dan) took charge of the lessons. In the first days the nature was not very kind to us and the river Blanice flooded most of the area under water. Not only taekwon-do practicioners, but mainly the organizers and other camps showed indomitable spirit, the situation was saved and the camps could continue. We were thus allowed to experience the joy of daily morning runs and morning and afternoon training sessions that were dedicated to fitness, self-defense, sports disciplines, fundamental techniques, balance and much more. In the afternoon there were opportunities for various sports activities and in the evening there was a space where individuals could arrange individual lessons or participate in breathing exercises under the guidance of Ivana Bohata. During the camp we could not miss a trip, which this time was to the town of Kamýk nad Vltavou, where we visited the ruins of the castle. Throughout the camp the participants were guided through the individual chambers of Shaolin prepared by David Roubal, where they could train their endurance, agility, knowledge and entertain the rest of the camp with their cultural performance. At the end of the camp, well-deserved rewards were prepared for the practitioners. At the end, there were grading, after which Martin Bambas received the I. Dan. The camp was coming to an end, but the enthusiasm from it will last until next year, where we will definitely meet again.

National Seminar 2021



After having missed last year's event, this year we were again honored to organize the National Technical Seminar under the leadership of Taekwon-Do legend - Master Jerzy Jedut, VIII. Dan. The event took place during the weekend of 13th and 14th November in the gym of the Emil Kolben Elementary School in Strančice.

The event was well attended by 52 participants from 6 Taekwon-Do schools from all over the country, from white belts to VIII. Dan. This year we were also honoured with the participation of Masters Rostislav Kaňka and Ondřej Vrábel.

The Saturday morning block was also for the holders of the lower colour belts and therefore it started more leisurely - some games to warm up, light stretching, basic techniques. The kick-shields were also put to use - we jumped on them and kicked them as well. In simple words, Master Jedut knows that practically every equipment has a multiple use.

After the morning session, it was clear to all participants that this will be, as always, a very dynamic seminar - no long talk, but a lot of exercise. The afternoon session was focused on patterns and the basic techniques used in them. Not only that the exercises were physically very difficult, but the quick change of different patterns and practicing techniques tested our ability to concentrate. Tuls were practiced up to the black belt. After five o'clock in the evening a group of physically and mentally tired people left the gym, but all with smiles, many ideas to think about and new exercises for themselves and the students in their clubs.

Sunday session was designated only for the black belt holders and the patterns from Kwang-Gae continued.

The patterns were accompanied by repetition and practice of three-step sparring in both one-way and two-way versions. Those, who attended the Saturday part of the seminar, showed visible signs of tiredness after the morning session. Many of them were happy to take advantage of the refreshments as pizza and possibly a cup of coffee.

The afternoon block was dominated by higher master patterns. We did all up to the Moon-Moo. Again, sparring drills were included for mental distraction, this time it was two-step and one-step sparring. The master prepared very interesting combinations of techniques. Some of them might have seemed impracticable at first sight, but in the end almost all the practitioners managed to literally fly through the air under the Master's careful supervision.

After the last bow, the President of the Czech National Taekwon-Do ITF Union, Jakub Roubal, and the coach of the Taekwon-Do Strančice club, Petra Bláhová, gave the prepared gifts to Master Jedut and thanked him on behalf of all of us for another excellent seminar.

Although it would have been a nice ending to the article, for some participants the day was not over yet. After the seminar, exams for the higher technical levels were held. The exams for the second Dan were requested by Ms. Vendula Loušová and for the third Dan the president of ČNUT, Mr. Jakub Roubal (both from Sparring Mnichovice School) applied.

Those who have ever seen the exams under the guidance of Master Jedut know that it is definitely not easy. Both of them, in addition to their new patterns, practiced several lower ones. Then followed a number of basic techniques, a large number of sparring, special techniques and a big pile of broken boards. Of course, there were also theoretical questions. Although the Master had a few comments on their performance, both candidates convinced him that they could be promoted and are now 3rd and 2nd Dan. Congratulations to both successful candidates!

Every event comes to an end and so we too had to say goodbye to the Master in the end.

Once again we are very grateful especially to Master Jedut, who was willing to come and lead our seminar even in this difficult time. As always we take with us a lot of new knowledge, comments on techniques and especially many common experiences, which are so valuable especially in this period.

Many thanks also to Master Vrábel, who translated throughout the seminar and added his own perspective on some of the techniques.

We also thank all the participants for their participation and their exemplary respect for all the locally valid regulations and the stricter hygiene regulations.

And we must not forget to thank the Emil Kolben Primary School, who warmly welcomed us in their school gym and prepared great facilities for us.

We are looking forward to seeing you again next year at the next edition of the National Seminar or even earlier at one of the joint events.
